

9 FEBRUARY – We are celebrating **Candlemas** with an All-Age

We will be swapping to a Gluten free soft pitta. If you have allergies or intolerance that mean you are unable to eat this, we will also have some gluten free wafers available. We hope this means people will be able to continue to receive Communion safely and that it will also be a more practical arrangement that is pastorally and theologically acceptable to the wider congregation. THE UNCONTROLLING LOVE OF GOD - Join us at Highgate House Conference Centre,

Northamptonshire, to discuss ideas that will change the way you think about the divine. Based around a series of set piece dialogues, this conference will open up avenues of theological thought that challenge the mainstream consensus that 'God' is all powerful and fundamentally 'in control'. Drawing on work from scholars and

practitioners from various parts of the Christian tradition, we will question these certainties and explore other ways of understanding the nature of God. More here

OUR FUTURE HEALTH -Like Pauline and myself, you may have already registered for this large scale NHS research to gather data for detecting and preventing diseases earlier, such as dementia, cancer, diabetes and heart disease. It involves completing an online questionnaire, giving a blood sample and having blood pressure checked. As data is gradually assessed you will have the option of learning your future risks and analysis of your DNA. Almost two million have signed up but millions more, any age over 18, are sought. THE ENVIRONMENT:

CLIMATE AND NATURE BILL- This was debated in the Commons on Friday the 24th. Unfortunately it was not passed because the government refused to allow Labour MPs a free vote. It was pushed back to 11 July which means realistically that is dead in the water. That is the bad news. The good news is that there have been positive and encouraging responses from Ed Miliband, the relevant Secretary of State, and Mary Creagh, Minister for Nature. At the end of yesterday's debate, the Minister for Nature, Mary Creagh, promised MPs that next steps will include "binding commitments" to advance the CAN Bill's objectives. Ed Miliband, said via a video (after the debate), he has promised to "set to work" on the CAN Bill's objectives—"including for legislation"—so that we can "make a meaningful difference for climate and nature". This means lots more letter writing to our MPs to keep the pressure up. Please get one off as soon as possible to make known your disappointment and to let them know that pressure to do what is needed will be relentless. *Michael Bayley*

GREAT GARDEN BIRD WATCH - The Environment Group once again did the Great Garden Bird Watch this January and counted blue tit, coal tit, robin, blackbird, woodpigeon, wren, magpie and crow. Small numbers though. Could we make our Green even more nature friendly? The birds seem to like the shrub cover at the eastern end. Perhaps we could extend the cover around our perimeters?
