CHANGE OF COMMUNION BREAD - We have changed the bread we are using for communion. The bread is dairy, egg, and gluten free. The ingredients are: Water, Rice Flour, Tapioca Starch, Potato Starch, Rapeseed Oil, Stabilisers: Hydroxypropyl Methyl Cellulose, Xanthan Gum, Yeast, Vegetable Fibres (Psyllium, Bamboo), Maize Flour, Potato Flakes, Humectant: Sorbitol, Sugar, Salt, Raising Agents: Diphosphates, Sodium Carbonates, Fermented Rice Flour, Acids: Tartaric Acid, Citric Acid.

Gluten free wafers are also available.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM ZERO HOUR

“Recently the Government blocked a joint committee report stating that the destabilising impact of the climate and nature crises on national security is one of the biggest risks facing Britain.

If the Government isn't going to share this risk with the public, we need to take matters into our own hands. That's why we're joining the call for politicians to attend a National Emergency Briefing taking place on 27 November just after COP30. The briefing will see world-leading experts report the latest evidence, clarify what is at stake, and outline actionable solutions.

We need MPs to rise to the challenge of the security risk that the climate and nature crises poses. First step? They need to get to grips with the depth of the problem and the cost of inaction. UPDATE ON LIVING IN LOVE AND FAITH

Last month the House of Bishops issued an [update on Living in Love and Faith](#). We discussed this at PCC last week and responded by sending the following statement to our Bishops.

The PCC of St Mark's, Broomhill and Broomhall, wishes to express its deep disappointment at the recent decision by the House of Bishops to delay the implementation of the Living in Love and Faith provisions.

We believe that this delay represents a failure to honour the decisions of General Synod and the process of discernment and consultation that so many across the Church have engaged in prayerfully and in good faith. The statement issued by the House of Bishops has, in our view, significantly undermined confidence in the LLF project and in the integrity of the Church's commitment to radical inclusion.

We are particularly grieved that the bishops appear to have yielded to pressure from those using threats of financial and institutional division—such as through the Ephesians Fund and similar measures—to resist progress towards greater inclusion. Such a capitulation risks legitimising bullying behaviour and deepens the pain experienced by LGBTQIA+ Christians and their allies, who have already borne the cost of the Church's hesitancy and exclusion for far too long.

We urge our Bishops to commit to implementing the LLF outcomes in a timely and transparent manner, enabling bespoke services of blessing, and allowing clergy to enter civil same sex marriages.

St Mark's remains steadfast in its commitment to full inclusion, justice, and the dignity of every person as made in the image of God.

NEW DATES FOR DEMENTIA STARS TRAINING – ONLY ONE PLACE LEFT - The daytime September Dementia Stars course led by Grace Stead of Enrichment for the Elderly has been very popular and helped attendees better understand how somebody with dementia experiences the world around them. Grace has agreed to lead an evening course in November. The course consists of 3x2 hour sessions (Bronze, Silver and Gold) on 3 successive Thursdays. There is no fee and it is important to try to attend all the sessions for greatest understanding. A certificate and badge are awarded to each participant attending each level. There is no test or exam. The course is suitable for newcomers, those involved in pastoral care and family or professional carers of people with dementia but is not for people who are themselves on the dementia pathway. The course will be held on Thursdays 13th, 20th and 27th November 6.30-8.30pm at Ranmoor Parish Centre, 5, Ranmoor Park Road, (Opposite St John's Church). Understanding Islam with Aameena Blake,
Muslim Chaplain to the University of Sheffield.

Muslims now play an important role in our nation and in our city. There are 4 million Muslims in England and Wales and 57,000 in Sheffield (2021 Census). But in this country, Islam is widely misunderstood. The activities of a few Islamic extremists capture the headlines, and little attention is given to the beliefs of the many law-abiding Muslims in our society. Christians and Muslims share Abrahamic roots and a reverence for Jesus, even if they see Him in very different ways. At St Mark's, we have over the years had friendly relations with Severn Road Mosque.

This session is for anyone who wishes to gain a better understanding of Islam. We have invited Aameena Blake, a well-qualified Islamic scholar, to talk about her faith and her own spiritual journey. Aameena has a master's in Islamic studies and qualifications in English, Teaching and Leadership. She is Muslim Chaplain for the University of Sheffield and South Yorkshire Police. She is founding Director of Eden Houses UK (EHUK) which provides refuge to women and children suffering domestic abuse. Among other things, she has studied women in the Quran.

Supported Lodgings is a relatively new service being run by the fostering service for young people aged 16-21. The fostering service say 'the requirement for their hosts are less than for being a foster carer (e.g. they can provide a home for a young person and be in fulltime work) we think the scheme works particularly well for young refugee young people (also known as Unaccompanied Asylum seeking children or UASC). Sheffield city Council Fostering Service have had people from really diverse backgrounds apply and feel that there may be a whole load of people out there who would be up for considering being a host but who just don't know about their scheme in the same way that people know and understand about fostering.'
