

Within these fragmented days, a gentle invitation threads through our lives, reminding us that all is sacred and rooted in a love that knows no bounds.







We commit ourselves to work for change to stand with those on the edge; to choose life and be used by the Spirit for God's new community of hope. Maranatha, come Lord Jesus.



Let us pray


May God be with you.

but deliver us from evil.




