

Introducing Annabelle

- Do you receive Annabelle as a gift from God? We do.

The minister asks What name have you given this child? Her name is Annabelle

The minister says:

God of love and life, we praise you for her birth; surround her with your blessings that she may know your love, be protected from all that threatens to harm her, and know your goodness all her days.

The Decision

Will you care for Annabelle, nurture and befriend her, listen to and play with her, keep her safe, and share your heart with her? With the help of God, I will. Will you help Annabelle, by your example and your teaching, to be honest and responsible, and to help others? With the help of God, I will. Let us affirm together our faith

Let us give thanks to our gracious God It is right to give thanks and praise God of abundant Life, we thank you for the gift of water to cleanse us and revive us.



Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this bread and wine to set before you, which earth has given and human hands have made. They will become for us the bread of life and cup of salvation. **Blessed be God for ever.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

Let us pray

We sit

May God be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to God.

Let us give thanks to our gracious God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, Lord God, our light and our salvation; to you be glory and praise for ever. From the beginning you have created all things and all your works echo the silent music of your praise. In the fullness of time you made us in your image, the crown of all creation. You give us breath and language, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a way to praise you:

Holy, holy, holy Lord **God of truth and love;** heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. **Blessed** is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord. As a mother tenderly gathers her children, you embraced a people as your own. When they turned away and rebelled your love remained steadfast. From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary, to be the living bread, in whom all our hungers are satisfied.

He offered his life for sinners, and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

On the night before he died, he came to supper with his friends and, taking bread, he gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Christ is the bread of life: When we eat this bread and drink this cup we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.

Father, we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross; we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand. Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. As we eat and drink these holy things in your presence, form us in the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory.

Bring us at the last with Mary, John, Mark and all the saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise: **Blessing and honour and glory and power** be yours for ever and ever. 
Final Hymn
