while others have insufficient.


We confess that we often spend our money with little regard for the impact of our spending on others or on the environment.

From the origins of our species, you called us into covenant to cultivate Paradise and make manifest the beauty of the earth.


When we made gods of ourselves and abused our freedoms, you inspired prophets and sages to challenge our pretensions and guide us in your ways.


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
With unceasing kindness you beckon us back to Eden to discover our integrity in communion with you and all your creatures.






Godof truthand love.

We break this bread in solidarity with the brokenness of the world.


In solidarity we accompany one another towards our recovery.


