Particularly needed are warm clothes in small women's sizes and NEW underwear in original packaging. Please leave any clothing on the table in the entrance corridor. Thank you.

Healing and wholeness:

Have faith communities anything to offer?

with Dr Charlotte Bryson, Dr Alice Newitt & Rev'd Dr Mark Newitt

What is health – the absence of disease or something more? Are health and wholeness the same thing? Is the NHS a 'health' service or an 'illness' service?

What factors contribute to the healing process or to sustaining health and wellbeing? Can a person with an impairment or terminal condition be whole? Is there a spiritual dimension to health and wholeness? Have faith communities a contribution to make? These are some of the questions that will be explored by three healthcare specialists during an evening of input and discussion.

Charlotte Bryson is a GP in Burngreave, an area of Sheffield characterised by ethnic diversity and a strong Muslim community. She specialises in working with the effects of trauma and in providing health care for refugees. Charlotte also has an interest in the humanity and inhumanity of a GP's life in the current healthcare and political climate.

Alice Newitt is a GP who works at Page Hall Medical Centre, Fir Vale, a vibrant ethnically diverse community with huge resilience and many challenges. She is also a medical educator teaching undergraduate students at Sheffield University. Alice specialises in affirming and developing people, health inequalities and supporting wellbeing.

Mark Newitt is the Secretary for Healthcare Chaplaincy at the Free Churches Group where his work supporting chaplains and engaging at a strategic level promotes the development of safe, effective and high-quality professional chaplaincy care. He also practices as a chaplain within the chaplaincy team serving Sheffield Teaching Hospitals.

RSPB's BIG GARDEN BIRDWATCH – Friday 23- Sunday 25 January The world's largest garden wildlife survey! Last year, nearly 600,000 people took part and over nine million birds were counted. We've lost a staggering 38 million birds from UK skies in the last 60 years. With birds facing so many challenges, it's more important than ever to get involved in the Birdwatch. ST MARK'S SOUP/SANDWICH RUN – Volunteers and Leaders Required

The Soup Run has been operating for many years and provides food and drinks for those unfortunately living on the streets of the City. The number of people we serve varies from month to month, but a few months ago we served over 20 people on one evening.

Over the last few years our numbers have dwindled and we now have only one group going out each month. Prior to Covid we had sufficient numbers to cover every week and we would like to try and get back to that position.

As a volunteer you would be involved in preparing sandwiches and drinks in the kitchen at St Marks and then walking around the city centre serving anyone in need. If you are interested in becoming a Leader, you would be additionally responsible for liaising with team members and ensuring that there are adequate stocks of drinks & food.

The current group meets on Sunday evenings at 5pm and are generally finished before 7pm, a relatively modest commitment.

ECO TIPS:



In October 2025, the Government committed to introduce legislation to end the sale of peat. The Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) are leading the way in getting growers, manufacturers and their own gardens transitioned to become Peat-Free.

From 2026, no new peat is allowed to enter RHS gardens or retail.

This is one area we can all contribute to.

As home gardeners, we need to understand that peat-free growing media is different than we are used to because it is more biologically active and has a shorter shelf-life. If you search RHS guidance on using peat-free compost, they have lots of tips to help you achieve the best results.
