Thinking Faith



How will Artificial Intelligence
Affect Us and the Church?
with Rev'd Dr Chris Goswami

Sunday 10 May 7pm

at St Mark's Broomhill and Broomhall

On the 2nd & 5th Sundays we tackle a different topic, with specialist input and questions from the floor.

Smartphones, chatbots, social media, personal assistants, health monitors, satnavs, online banking, shopping and entertainment, Artificial Intelligence is already transforming many aspects of daily living. Like any tool or technology, it can be employed in constructive and destructive ways – from medical diagnosis and surgical procedures to deepfakes and fraud. One thing is certain, AI is not going away, with some heralding it as the dawn of a new age for humanity, while others predict it will orchestrate the demise of our species. How should we respond and what impact will AI have upon religious belief and the practice of faith? These are some of the questions we will be addressing during this timely evening of input and discussion.

Chris Goswami worked for over thirty years in the high-tech telecoms industry, initially as a Software Engineer in the UK and progressing to become Vice President of Communications at a Silicon Valley based company. Brought up in the UK as a Hindu, Chris converted to Christianity in his late teens before serving local churches in various capacities. In 2017, he was ordained as a Baptist Minister and currently works as an Associate Minister at Lymm Baptist Church and Chaplain to Manchester Airport. He also lectures and writes on matters of faith, culture and technology. In addition to being a Chartered Engineer, Chris hold First Class degrees in Theology and Electronic Engineering, as well as a Masters and Doctorate in Telecommunications.

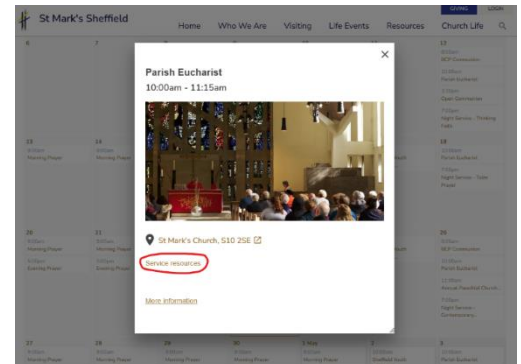

ADMINISTRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION – Those of you who have been at St Mark's for longer than 6 years will remember that before Covid the route the congregation took to receive Holy Communion was to leave the pew via the central aisle, proceed forward to receive Communion, then to return to your seat via the side aisles beside the windows. **From 3 May**, we returned to this approach which will reduce additional footsteps and ease the flow of people. The hand gel will be moved nearer to the front pew of church to enable those who use it before receiving Communion to continue to do so.

Thinking Faith



Is the USA a threat to
Western democracy?
with Professor Richard Carwardine

Sunday 31 May 7pm

at St Mark's Broomhill and Broomhall

On the 2nd & 5th Sundays we tackle a different topic, with specialist input and questions from the floor.

There is increasing anxiety in the UK and Europe about the behaviour of President Trump. He told the New York Times "I don't need international law"; his power was limited only by his "own morality". He appears impatient of the 'rule based order', the Western alliance and the United Nations. He has taken the USA out of myriad international organisations and aims to intervene in Europe to prevent 'civilisation erasure'. How can the Trump phenomenon be explained in terms of American history? Why do the safeguards in the US Constitution not constrain him? How should the UK and Europe respond?

Richard is Emeritus Rhodes Professor of American History at the University of Oxford, former President of Corpus Christi College, Oxford and a Fellow of the British Academy. He is best known for his work on Abraham Lincoln, for which he was awarded the Order of Lincoln, the highest honour of the State of Illinois. From 1971 to 2002, he taught American history at the University of Sheffield. He regularly visits America and closely monitors the political scene there. He has long been a member of St Mark's Church

DEMENTIA AWARENESS TRAINING

Supporting People with Dementia through Pastoral Care

Date: **Tuesday 19 May**, 10am Venue: Ranmoor Parish Centre, 5 Ranmoor Park Road, S10 3GX

During Dementia Action Week, Grace Stead, Director of Enrichment for the Elderly will lead this free introductory session. This two-hour session is open to Sheffield church members involved in dementia pastoral care, as well as anyone supporting someone on the dementia pathway. It will include practical guidance on communication and understanding dementia.

Dementia Stars Training

Dates: Fridays **12, 19 and 26 June at 2pm**

Venue: Ranmoor Parish Centre, 5 Ranmoor Park Road, S10 3GX

The three two-hour sessions (Bronze, Silver and Gold) explore how people with dementia experience the world and how we can best support them.

The course is free. Participants receive a badge and certificate after each session as recognition of their commitment. There are no tests, and attending all three sessions is strongly recommended.

HELP OUT:

WORSHIP IN CARE HOMES – We visit 3 of the 4 care homes in our parish on a monthly basis for about an hour to offer a service of hymns, readings and prayers or Holy Communion. This has been sustained by a small but dedicated team of lay people some of whom are now needing to stand down due to other commitments. We are therefore looking for 2 or 3 new volunteers to support the remaining team so there are always 2 people to go into the care home each visit. You don't need lots of experience and time, just a willingness to chat, read, sing or be present for residents in our local community who really value your company and the opportunity to share in a short act of worship. If you are interested, or know of someone else who might be, do have a conversation with Shan or Jennifer Hurrell and arrange to accompany other members of the team to see how they operate. If you decide you would like to volunteer on a regular basis, you would need to undertake basic and foundation safeguarding training which can be done online or with a group. Please pray about this and consider if you could be one of the people we are looking for. Shan

media. The briefing set out the implications of climate and nature breakdown for health, food systems, national security and the economy.

The People's Emergency Briefing presents the national implications of climate and nature breakdown - along with credible, positive responses - in a single, accessible account. The 45 minute film featuring Chris Packham, leading scientists, a former general and Jennifer Saunders includes scientific facts and reactions from members of the public. It sets out the threats we face, but also explains the opportunities if government takes genuine emergency action. Many of the MPs who saw the briefing said that, although the facts are alarming, it gave a sense of hope. If we confront the challenge together we can see a pathway towards a better future. Please note: this film is suitable for audiences aged 16 and over. It will be followed by the chance to talk together about the challenges ahead.
