
I am the bread of life, says the Lord.

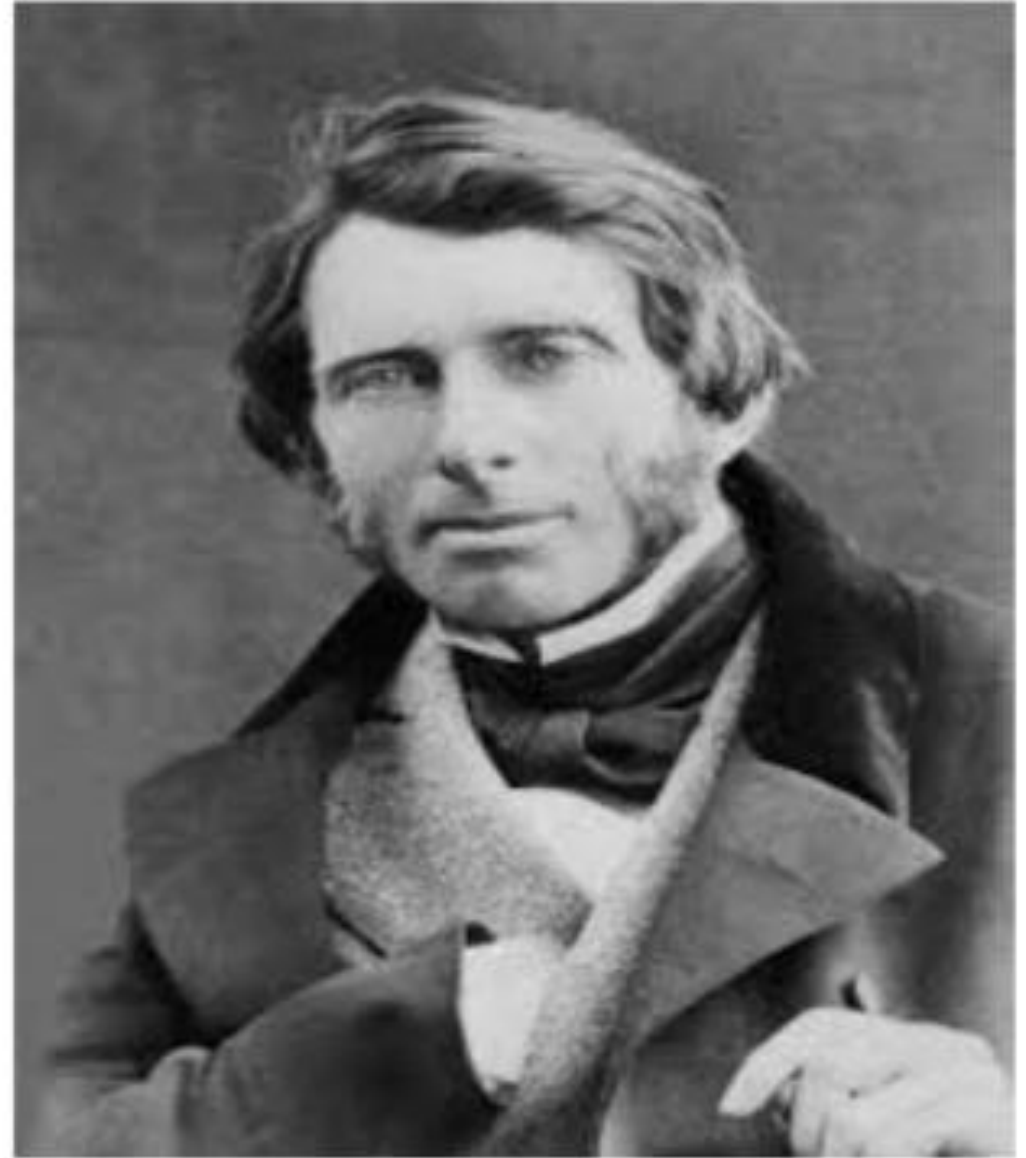
