transforming our lives and the whole of creation.

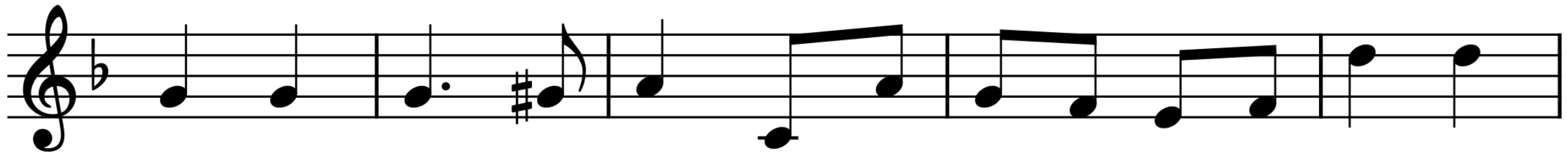



Sanctus*





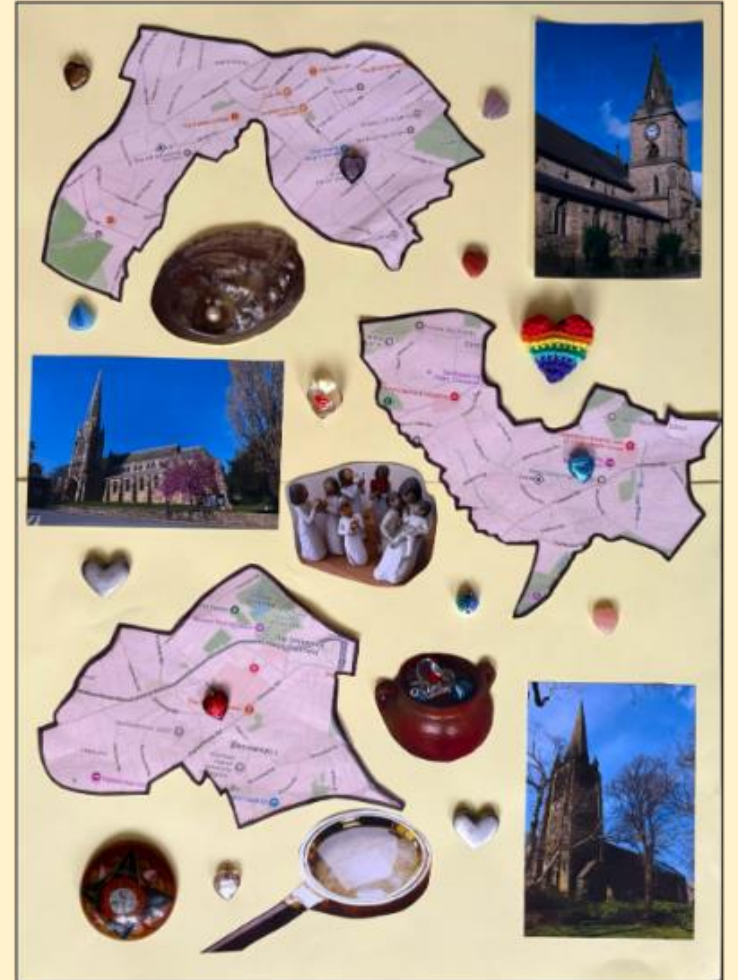


A simple and contemplative service, with the focus on remembering Jesus in sharing bread and wine.
