**VENEZUELA EARTHQUAKE APPEAL** - On Wednesday 24 June, two catastrophic earthquakes hit Venezuela within seconds of each other. The UN estimates that millions of people have been affected, with more than two million in the worst impacted areas. Families have lost loved ones, homes and the sense of safety and security they once knew.

Rescuers are searching for survivors, but the scale of loss is already significant. Together with the 14 other charities that make up the DEC, Christian Aid are launching a UK-wide appeal to meet the escalating needs of people affected by the earthquakes. Christian Aid colleagues are already working hard with our partners to assess the needs of our neighbours in Venezuela and ensure that our emergency response is exactly what and where it needs to be. 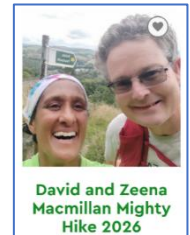

National Emergency Briefing

**You can see the film at St Mark's at Thinking Faith on Sunday 12 July at 7pm**

There is now a UK parliamentary petition calling for a UK-wide public briefing from independent experts on the risks posed by climate change and nature loss - and the opportunities if we respond at scale and with urgency saying

“The UK faces growing risks from climate and nature breakdown - from extreme weather to economic disruption and national security threats. Yet the public has never been given a clear national briefing on the scale of these risks. Government should hold an emergency briefing from leading experts.

These risks could have serious consequences across UK society, with threats to health and food supply which could become irreversible if without urgent action. Many people are unclear how these risks may affect them, and information in the public domain is often misleading.

A credible national briefing from independent experts would give people clear, trusted guidance on what these risks mean in practice, and what we can do - both together and individually - to prepare and respond.”

The aim is to reach 100,000 signatures to secure a Parliamentary debate, generate media attention, and significantly raise the profile of the National Emergency Briefing in Parliament. ## ECO TIPS:

**Plastic Free July** focuses on microplastic pollution. Fibres from synthetic clothes (eg polyester, nylon and acrylic) shed tiny fibres during washing and drying. These enter the sewage systems and are hard to filter out. Use a micro-fibre bag or ball to catch the fibres. [www.Plasticfreejuly.org](http://www.Plasticfreejuly.org)

A Guppy Friend Washing bag is 87% effective in catching microfibres and costs £25

A Cara Ball costs £30 and is 26% effective

A Microplastic Filtration device which fits onto the side of a washing machine is 90% effective and costs £52 from [www.PlanetCare.org](http://www.PlanetCare.org)

Bosch Microplastic Filtration device – filters up to 97% of microplastics and costs £199.
